MOTION TO ENTER AS DEFENDANT

COMES NOW Mark Townsend, in an effort to "save taxpayers money" and show unto this Honorable Court the following:

1. Mark Townsend is a qualified elector of the City of Haleyville School Board.
2. Mark Townsend was a candidate of the election in question and can bring light on this case and save taxpayers money.
3. Mark Townsend can prove that there was no mistake, misconduct, fraud, or corruption on the part of Christopher "Boo" Haughton or Steve Stott or the electors of the Haleyville School Board District.
4. Mark Townsend can prove that there was a mistake, misconduct, fraud, corruption, or criminal action on the part of Barry Tidwell, Royce Bennifield, Mark Butler,

Superintendent Clint Baggett, Vocational Director Gary Warren, and XYZ other persons involved in the below statements:

- A. The above named persons in their respected positions as Haleyville School leaders have taken federal money for vocational students and with full knowledge spent it on Haleyville School matters not in concert with vocational matters or federal vocational laws.

Footnote One (1)

The true name of Haleyville School of Technology is Haleyville (Area) Vocational Center.

Footnote Two (2)

From the birth of Haleyville Area Vocational Center, the students and member students consist of students from Haleyville, Bear Creek, Phil Campbell, Double Springs, Hackleburg, and others.

Footnote Three (3)

The above named persons have used the number of students outside of the Haleyville City School area to receive federal

money, but have turned away students from Bear Creek, demanding Marion County to pay eight hundred dollars (\$800) for each student.

Footnote Four (4)

The above named persons have received federal vocational money and used it as payments on the Haleyville Elementary School.

Footnote Five (5)

The above named persons have made known to bankers, bonding companies, Haleyville Mayor and City Counsel that they can make payments of over five hundred thousand dollars (\$500,000) per year for thirty (30) years on a ten million dollar (\$10,000,000) school project without using federal vocational money.

Footnote Six (6)

The above named persons have plans and have already paid a private architect to design a middle school with a lunch room, which appears to make the Haleyville City School system the first school system in Alabama with student numbers under two thousand (2,000) to have three lunch rooms.

Footnote Seven (7)

Six (6) years ago, Mark Townsend filed a lawsuit (misuse of federal vocational money) against Don Siegelman (President of Alabama State Board of Education), Ed Richardson (State of Alabama Superintendent), and Bravil Jackson (Superintendent of Marion County Schools) in which at the time JoBeth Townsend was a student at Bear Creek School. The federal Judge granted 11th Amendment Rights to Don Siegelman and Ed Richardson. However, this led to the removal of Ed Richardson as State of Alabama Superintendent.

Footnote Eight (8)

Mark Townsend ran for State School Board Member on the platform of all vocational centers should have elected board members and not just an advisory board. Mark Townsend lost an eleven county race, due to the votes cast in the City of Haleyville. This loss was possibly due to the fact that Mark Townsend was using Haleyville Area Vocational Center as a “Poster Child” of how federal vocational money was being placed in schools’ general funds all over the State of Alabama.

Footnote Nine (9)

The City of Haleyville is in Marion County, where taxpayers pay taxes to the City of Haleyville. The taxpayers of Marion County were not given the right to be candidates in the Haleyville School Board election.

Footnote Ten (10)

Haleyville City School is a member of the Southern Association.


Footnote Eleven (11)
