- All Haleyville City Schools have had an exceptionally smooth start for the 2011-2012 school year. Many factors are involved in a school year's start up, the planning of our administrators and teachers, the assistance of our Mayor and Council, the police department along with our crossing guard and most of all, the parents and students, all play important roles and all share credit for this success. It has been said many times we are a Community School system, and it is the truth, without the cooperation of our entire community, we would not be able to achieve near as much as we do and we recognize how very blessed we are with such a supportive school community. It appears that our enrollment is up at all schools our principals report that classes are in full swing and schedules are pretty much set for the year.
- It is with much pride that I publicly announce that once again, the Haleyville City Schools system "Made AYP" (Adequate Yearly Progress) under the requirements of No Child Left Behind federal legislation. This is the highest rank a system can earn and we are proud to have received this designation every year it has been in effect.
- Another system wide brag is the achievement of our 2011 graduates on the ACT exam. Our graduates scored higher than the state average of students ready for college-level

coursework in English, Algebra, Social Science and Biology along with their composite score also being above the state average. This is a testament to our faculty for doing an outstanding job preparing students for the postsecondary level of study.

- We have been notified of two grant awards for our system:
 - 1) The 2011 College Access Challenge Grant in the amount of \$30,000 through the Haleyville City Center of Technology to be used for activities related to the development of a mobile guidance computer lab to be housed at the Center.
 - 2) The 21st Century Community Learning Centers grant for Haleyville Elementary, Middle and High Schools has been awarded in the amount of \$200,000 per year, renewable for three years for a total of \$600,000. This grant will provide an after school program for Elementary and Middle School students and a before school tutorial program for the Middle and High School students along with partnerships with various community based organizations.
